

IN THE MATTER OF
ROBERT LEE PARKMAN, JR., M.D.
ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

A hearing was held by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners on the 1st day of May, 1972, on a charge brought by the Board against Dr. Robert Lee Parkman, Jr., of having been convicted of a crime, in order to determine if just cause exists for a suspension of his license to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana in accordance with Louisiana Revised Statutes 37:1285 (1).

The entire Board was present for the hearing, and Dr. Parkman was present and represented by counsel, Messrs. Leppert, Gill and Gaudin.

After reviewing the evidence and memorandum submitted by counsel, and hearing the arguments of counsel, the Board issued the following finding of fact, conclusion of law, and decision.

FINDING OF FACT NO. 1

Dr. Robert Lee Parkman, Jr., was in fact convicted of a crime, to-wit: 18 counts of violations of Title 18, United States Code Section 1341, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Louisiana, on the 24th day of February, 1972.

CONCLUSION OF LAW NO. 1


Just cause does exist in fact for suspension of Dr. Robert Lee Parkman, Jr.'s license to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana and in accordance with Louisiana Revised Statutes 37:1285 (1), conviction of a crime.

DECISION

Considering the foregoing, the license of Dr. Robert Lee Parkman, Jr., to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana is hereby suspended for a period of three years, commencing on the 1st day of July, 1972, or until modified or reinstated by the Board prior to that time.
