CONSENT ORDER FOR REPRIMAND

The Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (the "Board") conducted an investigation of Brian Wayne Sparks, PA, ("Mr. Sparks") who has been licensed in Louisiana since September 15, 2009 and practicing in the area of Family Medicine in and around Minden, Louisiana. The Board has developed reliable information indicating that Mr. Sparks exceeded the authority granted him by his license by prescribing a medication to another Physician Assistant without the knowledge and consent of his Supervising Physician, outside of a clinical setting, and without maintaining a medical record.

Mr. Sparks now recognizes that his actions were inappropriate, and offers that they were not intentional but the result of his misunderstanding of the rules governing PA practice, which he has now corrected.

Predicated on the foregoing, the Investigating Officer ("I/O") appointed by the Board with respect to this investigation has determined that probable cause exists for recommending to the Board that an Administrative Complaint be filed in this matter charging Mr. Sparks with violation of the Louisiana Physician Assistant Practice Act, La. Rev. Stat. §37:1360.33(3), ("the Act"), and the Board's Rules pertaining to Physician Assistants, La. Adm. C. 46: XLV§4506 A(1)<sup>2</sup> §4506 C.1, and §4511 A(4).<sup>3</sup>

As evidenced by his subscription hereto, Mr. Sparks acknowledges the substantial accuracy of the foregoing information and that proof of such information upon an administrative evidentiary hearing could constitute sufficient cause under the Act for the imposition of such terms, conditions, or restrictions on his license to practice as a physician assistant in the state of Louisiana as the Board may deem appropriate.

Recognizing his right to have notice of any such allegations and charges asserted against him, to administrative adjudication of such charges, at which time he would be entitled to be represented by legal counsel, to call witnesses and to present evidence on his own behalf in defense or in mitigation of the charges made, and to a decision thereon by the Board based upon written findings of fact and conclusions of law, pursuant to La. Rev. Stat. §§ 49:951, et seq., Mr. Sparks nonetheless, hereby waives his right to formal adjudication and pursuant to La. Rev. Stat. §49:955(D), consents to entry of the Order set forth hereinafter. Mr. Sparks further acknowledges that he waives any right to which he may be entitled pursuant to the Louisiana Administrative Procedure Act, La. Rev. Stat. §§49:951, et seq. or which otherwise may be afforded to him by law, to contest his agreement to or the force and effect of the Board's investigation or this document in any court or other forum relating to the matters referred to herein.

By his subscription hereto, Mr. Sparks also hereby authorizes the I/O to present this Consent Order to the Board for its consideration and to fully disclose to and discuss with the Board the nature and results of the investigation, and he waives any objection to such disclosures to the Board under La. Rev. Stat. §49:960. Mr. Sparks expressly acknowledges that the disclosure of information to the Board by the I/O shall be without prejudice to I/O's authority to proceed with the filing and adjudication of an administrative complaint against him, or to the Board's capacity to adjudicate such complaint, should the Board decline to accept this Consent Order.

Accordingly, in consideration of the foregoing and pursuant to the authority vested in the Board by La. Rev. Stat. §37:1326 and La. Rev. Stat. § 49:955(D);

IT IS ORDERED that Brian Wayne Sparks, PA. is hereby OFFICIALLY REPRIMAND for the conduct described hereinabove:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Sparks' license to practice as a physician assistant and his continuing exercise of the rights and privileges granted to him thereby, shall be subject to his acceptance and strict compliance with the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Payment of Fine. Mr. Sparks shall pay a fine of \$1,000.00 to the Board, within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this Order;
- 2. Continuing Medical Education-Professionalism and Proper Prescribing. Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Order, Mr. Sparks shall successfully complete one or more courses of study in the area of professionalism and proper prescribing. All courses required by this provision shall be pre-approved by the Board or its designee;
- 3. Demonstration of Understanding-Board's Rules. Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Order, Mr. Sparks shall provide evidence to the Board's satisfaction that he has gained an understanding of and is practicing in accordance with the law and the Board's rules and regulations respecting physician assistants; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the failure of Brian Wayne Sparks, PA to fully comply with the above terms within the allotted time may give rise to such further action against his license to practice as a physician assistant in the state of Louisiana as the Board may deem appropriate, as if such violation was enumerated among the causes provided in La. Rev. Stat. §37:1360.33(3).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Consent Order shall be, and shall be deemed to be, a public record.
